- Accomplishment #1: 21 households of Orphans and Vulnerable Children assisted with decent housing.
- Accomplishment #2: 14 households of Persons with Disabilities assisted with decent houses.
- Accomplishment #3: 423 households of people affected by disaster assisted with disaster resilient houses.
- Accomplishment #4: Over 7,000 people supported with access to safe water and improved latrines.
